What kinds of activities does AMWSA promote?

AMWSA encourages activities that reflect our core values of faith, sisterhood, and service. Each chapter can tailor its events to fit the needs of its campus and community. Some examples include interfaith events, Qur'an discussions, career panels, community service projects, group study sessions, and sisterhood bonding events.

How is AMWSA distinguished from other Muslim or religious organizations on campus?

AMWSA is a women-led religious and professional organization rooted in the values of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community. While we share space with other Muslim and interfaith groups, AMWSA offers a unique space focused on supporting Muslim women through faith-based learning, leadership, and sisterhood. We welcome women of all backgrounds and aim to create a space where diverse perspectives are honored and traditionally underrepresented voices are uplifted.

Why is AMWSA a women-only organization?

AMWSA is rooted in the values of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community, which includes encouraging modest and respectful interactions between men and women. We believe that women-only spaces are powerful and necessary — they offer an environment where young women can feel safe to lead, grow, and speak openly. Studies show that single-sex spaces help women build confidence, take initiative, and strengthen their voices. AMWSA aims to foster exactly that kind of empowering space.

Who oversees AMWSA?

All AMWSA chapters in the U.S. are overseen by the National Umoore Talibaat Secretary under Lajna Ima'illah USA.

AMWSA chapters are encouraged to apply for funding through their student government or campus academic departments. In some cases, Lajna Ima'illah USA or local Lajna chapters can offer support, though funding is not guaranteed.

What is AMWSA's relationship with AMSA?

The Ahmadiyya Muslim Student Association (AMSA) is our brother organization under Majlis Khuddamul-Ahmadiyya. Ahmadi Muslim women can only be members of AMWSA and should join it once its established. However, both groups may collaborate on joint initiatives, such as interfaith events, while maintaining Islamic guidelines.
